Drugs & Alcohol (secondary only)

Students in Sonoma County Schools schools were asked whether, during the past month, they have used any of

Obstacles to Learning (secondary only)

Students are asked whether, various circumstances make it hard for them to do their best.

Local Resilience Ouestions (secondary only)

Engagement

This summary measure describes the degree to which staff feel engaged in their work and empowered to influence their schools.

Relationships

This summary measure describes the degree to which staff experience positive relationships in their school based on respect, care and

STAFF

Culture

This summary measure describes the degree to which staff believe that their school fosters a culture of shared vision, respect, and effective communication.

Professional Development & Support

This summary measure describes the degree to which staff receive meaningful feedback, have opportunities to grow professionally and feel supported in their work.

School Safety

This summary measure describes the degree to which staff feel the school is a safe learning environment.

Engagement

This summary measure describes the degree to which families are engaged in their school and empowered to influence decision making.

FAMILY

Relationships

This summary measure describes the degree to which families experience positive relationships in their school based on respect, care and approachability.

Culture

This summary measure describes the degree to which families believe their school fosters shared goals, respect, fairness, and diversity.

Communications & Feedback

This summary measure describes the degree to which there are open and effective lines of communication between families and schools.

Resources

This summary measure describes the degree to which families believe that their school deploys the necessary resources to support students.

School Safety

This summary measure describes the degree to which families believe that their school is a safe place for students.

How do YouthTruth's 4Ds help us stay curious about the data?



Defensive

Attack other; avoid taking ownership; only look outward for explanation



Dismissive

Questions data validity or survey methodology; skeptical of value of student voice



Dejected

Attack self; avoid because it's hard to hear; only notice the negative; "we're doing it all wrong"



Downplay the negative

Only latching onto positive data; trouble hearing constructive criticism


